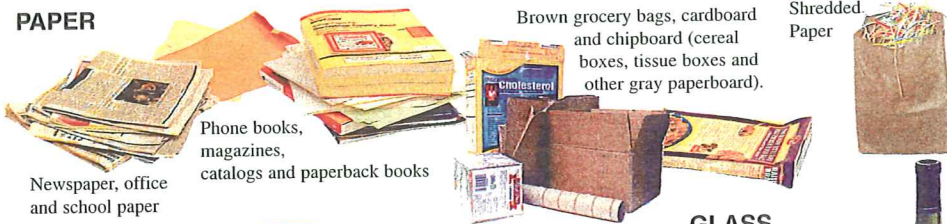


RECYCLING IS EASY

The items shown here are the materials we accept for recycling.

PAPER



Newspaper, office and school paper

Phone books, magazines, catalogs and paperback books

Brown grocery bags, cardboard and chipboard (cereal boxes, tissue boxes and other gray paperboard).

Shredded Paper

ALUMINUM AND STEEL/TIN FOOD AND BEVERAGE CANS



Empty non-hazardous aerosols

GLASS BOTTLES AND JARS



PLASTIC BOTTLES

Only those with a neck or pouring spout *and* with or on the bottom



IF IT'S NOT A BOTTLE, THROW IT OUT!

COMMON MISTAKES

These items cannot be placed in your recycling container.



NO foil and foil coated items

NO wax coated boxes or cartons

NO food contaminated boxes

NO hardback books

NO plastic bags, pails, trays, tubs and lids

NO motor oil, lubricants, paint and pesticide containers

NO bottle caps, lids or stoppers

NO mugs, glasses, vases, bulbs

Recycling markets will not take them.
DO NOT RECYCLE THEM.

GET READY TO RECYCLE!

BOTTLES & CANS

- Rinse clean (to conserve water, rinse with leftover dishwater)
- Throw away caps & lids
- Flatten large plastic bottles (if you wish)
- Never flatten beer & soda cans
- Never put in plastic bags
- Never break glass
- Put bottles and cans altogether in your bucket

PAPER & CARDBOARD

- Put in brown paper bags or tie with string or twine
- *Never* place in plastic bags
- If you must, you can use a small rigid container, such as a milk crate or laundry basket, to hold your paper.
- Cardboard taken to a dropoff must be flattened
- Recyclables should be curbside by 6 am!!
- OTC will not pick up recyclables put out late or on the wrong date.
